On July 1, 2011, California Assembly Bill 354 requires that all 7th grade students entering school for the 2012-13 school year will be required to provide proof of a Tdap (Pertussis) booster. This may be met by receiving this booster on or after your child's 7th birthday.

Special Classes for Kids & Teens (one-week programs)



Drawing and Painting (8-12-year-olds): Focusing on drawing and painting techniques, students will draw a variety of subjects including people, animals, still life and imaginary characters using ink, markers, soft and oil pastels as well as watercolor and tempera.

Summer Fun with Math Skills (Grades 2 & 3): Learning can be fun! Students use manipulatives and games to learn estimation, addition, subtraction, multiplication and fractions.

Writing Academy (Grades 2 & 3): Students learn to take their writing to the next level, focusing on sentence construction, beginning paragraphs, the writing process, penmanship, expository writing, punctuation, and persuasive writing.

Brush up on Your Math Skills (Grades 4 & 5): Students in this fun summer class will learn grade level math concepts, math facts and word problems. Topics include addition and subtraction, fractions, multiplication and division will also be covered.

Writing Academy (Grades 4 & 5): A fun and creative atmosphere helps students learn paragraph writing, sentence structure, persuasive writing, and penmanship, as well as how to create short essays and personal narratives.

Pre-Algebra Basics (11-13-year-olds): A great review and preparation for junior high math, this class will include a review of elementary mathematics and principles, introduction to signed numbers, beginning rules for algebraic evaluations, and algebraic equations.

Algebra I Problem Solving (12-14-year-olds): Students will gain a basic knowledge of problem solving strategies and feel more comfortable beginning an Algebra I class. Topics include variables and algebraic equations, real numbers, integers, evaluating expressions, and solving inequalities and inequalities.

Introduction to High School Geometry (12-16-year-olds): Geometry concepts will be introduced including geometric definitions and constructions, congruence and measurement, inductive and deductive reasoning skills.

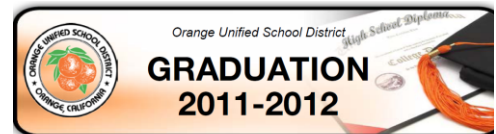
Algebra II (14-18-year-olds): Building upon a solid knowledge base from basic Algebra, students will review of Algebra I, advanced polynomials, rational equations and negative exponents to use with radical functions.
